

### 1958 Cadillac Eldorado Brougham

The 1957-58 **Cadillac Eldorado** Brougham was a hand built, limited production car derived from the Park Avenue and Orleans show cars of 1953-54. It featured the first appearance of quad headlights and totally The unique trim. exterior ornamentation included wide, ribbed lower rear quarter beauty panels extending along the rocker sills and rectangularly sculptured side body "cove" highlighted with five horizontal windsplits on the rear doors. Tail styling treatments followed the Eldorado pattern. This four-door hardtop with rearhinged rear doors was an ultraluxury car that cost an astonishing \$13,074 - twice the price of any other Eldorado and more than the Rolls-Royce Silver Cloud.

It featured a stainless steel roof, air suspension, the first automatic two-position "memory" power seats, a dual four-barrel carburator, low profile tires with thin white-walls, automatic trunk opener, Cruise Control, high pressure cooling system,

polarized sun visors, electric antenna, automatic-release parking brake, electric door locks, dual heating system, silver magnetized glove box, drink tumblers, cigarette and tissue dispensers, lipstick and cologne, ladies compact with powder puff, mirror and matching leather notebook, comb and mirror, Arpège atomizer with Lanvin perfume, automatic starter with restart function, Autronic Eye, drum-type electric clock, power windows, forged aluminum wheels and air conditioning. Buyers of Broughams had a choice of 44 full leather interior and trim combinations and could select such items as Mouton, Karakul or lambskin carpeting. An all-transistor signal-seeking car radio, first available for the Eldorado Brougham, was standard equipment and used 13 transistors in its circuitry. Only 704 Eldorado Broughams were sold.

Then it was off to lunch at Cody's Roadhouse Grille or Johnny Rockets or Too jay's New York Style Deli. After lunch we moved to Center Square at Lakeside Landing were the finish line was getting set-up. The official time for the contenders to arrive was suppose to be 1:00 PM but was postponed until 2:00 so that the TV crew could arrive to broadcast live the event. Many of our Venice AACA members traveled to "The Villages" to see the finish of the 32nd annual, world famous, "GREAT RACE" event. The entry fees for this event range from \$5000 for private to \$6500 for corporate entries. The starting line for the race was Ogunquit, Maine. Entries left the 2300 mile competitive controlled speed endurance road rally on June 21st and nine days latter arrived at the finish line in "The Villages", south of Ocala, FL. This Rally for Vintage Cars, 1972 model year or older, is limited to 100 autos. The purse is \$150,000 and the winner receives \$50,000. The event was purchased by Corky Coker, owner of Coker Tire Company and is sponsored by Hemming's Motor News and Hagerty Insurance. 18 cities on the East Coast will act as check points along the way. Each car is assigned a Driver and Navigator. They must drive at or below the posted speed at all times. GPS and Computers are not permitted and Odometers are taped over.
